

Is hemorrhoid energy therapy covered by my insurance plan?

The HET™ bipolar system is covered by Medicare and most major insurance carriers.*


The HET $^{\infty}$ Bipolar Forceps and Temperature Monitor are intended to be used for grasping, manipulating, and coagulating soft tissue during general surgery.

The HET^m Bipolar System may be used for the treatment of symptomatic grade I and grade II internal hemorrhoids.

What are hemorrhoids?

Hemorrhoids are a collection of blood vessels in the lower rectum. Everyone is born with hemorrhoids as a normal part of the vascular tissue in the rectum. However, hemorrhoidal tissue can enlarge and may require treatment.

Common symptoms that may require treatment include:

- Rectal bleeding during bowel movements
- Prolapse (tissue comes outside of anus) during bowel movements
- Itching or discomfort in the anal area


What is hemorrhoid energy therapy using the HET™ bipolar system?

The HET™ bipolar system is a gentle, simple, and efficient non-surgical treatment method for symptomatic low grade hemorrhoids. Its design allows treatment of all hemorrhoids in one procedure. The HET™ bipolar system uses a relatively low power energy to target vascular tissue and treat hemorrhoids with minimal or no pain. Ask your physician about a hemorrhoid treatment with minimal discomfort.

How is the HET™ bipolar system different than other hemorrhoid treatment options?

Treatment with the HET^{m} bipolar system is a fast therapy that typically takes only seconds to complete.

Many hemorrhoid treatment options, including banding and infrared coagulation, often require multiple procedures. In contrast, the HET™ bipolar system can be used to treat multiple hemorrhoids in a single therapy session. ^{3,4}



How the HET™ bipolar system works

Inserted into the rectum, low power energy is delivered to the blood supply feeding enlarged hemorrhoid — not to the hemorrhoid itself. This causes the blood volume to be reduced and the hemorrhoid to shrink in size.

Is the HET™ bipolar system right for treating my hemorrhoids?

While both internal and external hemorrhoids are generically called hemorrhoids, these conditions are different — they cause different symptoms and are treated differently.

Your doctor can tell you whether your hemorrhoids are internal or external. Internal hemorrhoids are classified according to their severity to grade I-IV. Grades I and II internal hemorrhoids are considered mild-to-moderate and can be treated with nonsurgical methods, such as the HET™ bipolar system.

Is hemorrhoid energy therapy painful?

In a retrospective study of 23 patients, all patients reported minimal to no pain or discomfort from internal hemorrhoid treatment with the HET^{TM} bipolar system.¹

In a prospective study of 20 patients who failed previous treatments, there was minimal or no pain during and after the HET™ procedure.²
